

UTM Grabber for Real Cookie Banner


By default, UTM Grabber will collect the user data regardless of Real Cookie Banner consent decision.

If you want UTM Grabber to wait for the consent from Real Cookie Banner. Do the following:

Set UTM Grabber to recognize Real Cookie Banner

Go to UTM > GDPR

Check Real Cookie Banner (Free) box.

Create Consent for UTM Grabber in Real Cookie Banner

Go to Cookies > Services (Cookies)

Create UTM Grabber Cookies and assign it to any group.

Here we created for Essential group

- Provider:** HandL Digital LLC. A note states: "A service always has an 'owner', who processes collected data or information saved in cookies etc. Please specify which provider creates cookies and processes personal data, e.g. 'Google Ireland Limited'. If you are the provider, please enter your legal name."
- Purpose:** (Empty text area). A note states: "The ePrivacy Directive and the GDPR require that a non-professional user understands the purpose of this service, how personal data is collected and how cookies are used for this purpose."
- Privacy policy of the provider:** https://utmgrabber.com/. A note states: "Provide a direct link to the privacy policy of the provider that runs this service (in the language of your website)."
- Legal basis:** Consent (Opt-in) (selected), Legitimate interest (Opt-out). A note states: "Services can be used on various legal bases according to [Art. 6 GDPR](#). 'Consent' means that the user must explicitly agree to the service (opt-in). 'Legitimate interest' means that your interest as a website operator prevails to use the service and the user must explicitly disagree (opt-out). Unless it is an essential service. Then an objection is not possible. A legitimate interest exists only in rare cases and only for data processing. If you are not sure, it is better to obtain consent to be on the safe side."
